## Texas Scholars at Fort Stockton High School

Texas Scholars is a program designed to motivate all students to complete the rigorous coursework required to earn the State Recommended Program Seal. The program emphasizes college prep courses in mathematics, science, social studies, language arts, foreign language, fine arts, speech, technology applications and PE/Health. Course grade requirements are $70+$ or better, with an emphasis on better.

Fort Stockton High School Texas Scholars complete a specific curriculum that provides a high level of college and career readiness and they also complete hours of community volunteer duty. Students choose to be Texas Scholars to help assure their high school education encourages them to be college and career ready. Texas Scholars are recognized at graduation and awards assemblies as well as Fort Stockton Pioneer.

Students can become a Texas Scholar by choosing to complete the Texas Scholar curriculum at your Fort Stockton High School and performing community service hours. Volunteer work presents a great opportunity for teenagers to prepare for the future, as well as to improve their communities. In addition to boosting socializing skills and awareness of local organizations and social issues, high school students who often volunteer may have an advantage over their peers when headed off to college.
